

Subir Bhaumik is a veteran journalist with 33 years of experience in covering East and Northeast India and the neighbouring countries like Bangladesh, Myanmar, Bhutan, Nepal and China. He was BBC's Eastern India bureau chief for 17 years. Later he was founder-editor of the now-defunct Seven Sisters Post and is currently senior editor with Dhaka-based bdnews24.com.

Bhaumik is a former Queen Elizabeth House Fellow at Oxford University and Eurasian-Nets Fellow at Frankfurt University. He has been involved in research projects with East-West Centre, Washington and many other research institutes in India and abroad.

Bhaumik is author of 'Insurgent Crossfire' and 'Troubled Periphery', two well acclaimed books on South Asia's 'Proxy Wars' and India's troubled Northeast.

He has edited two more -- "Counter-Gaze: Media, Migrants, Minorities" and "Living on the Edge : Bangladesh's Chittagong Hill Tracts".

Bhaumik has written for many volumes edited by leading scholars and delivered papers at seminars in India and abroad.

He is now Senior Fellow at CSIRD and closely connected with the K2K process.
